- Things to Consider:
- Location
- Traditional or Modern

Location

- Hertford, Teddy Hall and Mansfield are centrally located, but house their students across Oxford
- Lady Margaret Hall, St Anne's and St Catherine's are slightly further out, but house their students on-site
- Worcester is the only college that is both centrally located and houses their students on-site

Accommodation

- Lady Margaret Hall, St Anne's & Worcester College usually house students in college and in single rooms (ensuite or shared bathrooms)
- St Catherine's house students in college, but in twin rooms (en-suite or shared bathrooms)
- St Edmund Hall house students either in college or in offsite Halls in single rooms (en-suite or shared bathrooms)
- Mansfield and Hertford house students off-site in Halls in single rooms (en-suite or shared bathrooms)



- All colleges have dining halls and students are encouraged to use them
- · Most accommodations have small kitchens
- All accommodation has internet access either through wifi or ethernet connection
- All have laundry facilities, for which you have to pay!

Subjects

- All of the Oxford Colleges teach most subjects e.g. PPE, English, History, Psychology and Mathematics
- St Anne's and St Edmund are the only colleges that offer lab based courses e.g. Biochemistry
- The Tutorial System

- Hertford College 400 undergraduates (20 25 Visiting Students)
- Lady Margaret Hall 400 (25 30)
- Mansfield College -220 (20)
- St Anne's College 425 (30 35)
- St Catherine's College 476 (50)
- St Edmund Hall 400 (30 35)
- Worcester College -430 (25)

- One of the best cultural scenes outside of London


















Pembroke is a medium-sized college with 35 spaces for visiting students each semester. Located 10 minutes from lecture halls and faculties at Cambridge, and centrally located very near city center.

Pembroke's dining hall, called the Buttery, is award wining and certified food allergy aware – with separate kitchen space and color-coded utensils for allergy-friendly menu items.

Oxford and Cambridge: more alike than different

- · Admissions qualifications are the same.
- Difference: Matriculation
- Difference: Academics
 - Tripos System (Supervision Lecture Examination)
 - Semester-based program for visiting students with 2 Supervisions (12 US Semester Credits) per semester
 - · Limited curriculum available to visiting students

Building a strong application

- Writing Samples
- Sufficient Background
 - AP does not count, dual-credit does
- · Choose academic references wisely
- Admissions
 - Cambridge: Admissions are rubric-based and *rolling* from 1 January until all 35 seats are filled (apply by 1 February for best chance)
 - Oxford: Admissions are subject to departmental preferences and not rolling. Decisions can take 6-12 weeks (except St. Catz).
